PARAMETERS

a) Notebook Submission

Notebook submission as part of Internal Assessment, is aimed at evaluating and enhancing seriousness of students towards preparing notes on the topics being taught in the classroom as well as assignments. This will also address the critical aspects of regularity, punctuality, neatness and upkeep of notebook.

b) Subject Enrichment Activities

These are subject specific activities aimed at evaluating and enhancing the understanding and skills of the students. These activities are to be carried out throughout the term by the respective subject teachers. However, these should be evaluated at the term-end.

- i) For Languages: Aimed at equipping the learners to develop effective listening and speaking skills-reading, recitation, roleplay etc.
- ii) For Mathematics: For the Activities in Mathematics-Mental Math's or Project work can be undertaken.
- iii) For Science: Projects, Activities and Experiments.
- iv) For Social Science: Map work or the project work to be undertaken.
- v) Computer: Practical Work.
- vi) General Knowledge: Newspaper Projects.
- vii) French & Sanskrit: Activities and project work.

Marks & Weightage:

- c) Periodic Tests: Max. marks of Question papers for each PT and for each subject will be 30 MARKS.
 - (A weight age of 10 for per Paper will be calculated for Term 1 & TERM 2)
 - > For Computer: (20 MARKS written).
 - For G.K.: Maximum marks of question paper will be 20 MARKS for each PT.
- <u>d)</u> <u>Notebook and Subject Enrichment-</u> Maximum marks & weightage will be 5 marks each in both terms.
- e. ORALS: A weightage of 2 PER PAPER WILL BE CALCULATED IN TERM 1 & 2.
- <u>f.</u> <u>Mid Term Examination:</u> Maximum marks of Question Paper will be set for **80 marks** for English, Hindi, Math's, Science, S.Studies, Sanskrit, French (A weightage of **40 (50%)** will be calculated for all the subjects.)
 - For Computer: (30 MARKS written+ 20MARKS practical).
 - For G.K.: Maximum marks of question paper will be 30 MARKS.
- g. <u>Annual Examination:</u> Maximum marks of Question Paper will be set **for 80 marks** for English, Hindi, Maths, Science, S.Studies, Sanskrit, French (A weight age of 40 (50%) will be calculated for all the subjects.)
 - For Computer: (30 MARKS written+ 20 MARKS practical).
 - For G.K.: Maximum marks of question paper will be 30 MARKS.
